



The North Scott Community YMCA opened as the 7th full-service facility under the YMCA of the lowa Mississippi Valley on Dec. 3, 2022. The project was funded and coordinated through a collaboration between the City of Eldridge, the North Scott School District, and the YMCA.





Eldridge Police Department K-9 Unit

In June, the Eldridge Police Department announced that it had received enough funding through grants and donations to establish the City's first K-9 Unit.

The Police Department purchased a 2-years old German Shephard that was imported from Hungary. The K-9 was named Marty by request of the donor.

Marty was partnered with Officer Jacob Costas. The team started training in July at Cedar Creek Kennels and will begin official patrol duties in Eldridge later this year.




SRF \$775 WATER QUALITY GRANTS

Soil Quality Restoration: The City dedicated \$129K to a fund matching program for Eldridge residents to aerate, fertilize, and seed their lawns. This program improves the quality of stormwater runoff and reduces the pollutants entering the City's storm sewer system and waterways using best management practices.

Permeable Alleys: The City dedicated \$580K to complete 3 permeable pavement projects on 3 alleys in Eldridge. This project allows for adequate treatment of storm water quality volume in accordance with the standards set forth in the lowa Stormwater Management Manual.

Streambank Stabilization: The City dedicated \$65.5K to the Hickory Creek stabilization project. This project included riparian buffering on the steep bank slopes for erosion control and native vegetative seeding.




Park IMPROVEMENTS

Crandall Park has a new T-Ball field thanks to a donation from Eldridge T-Ball.

Construction finished two weeks ago on the Eldridge Buttermilk Irrigation Project thanks to a grant from the Scott County Regional Authority. The Park Board approved a \$135K contract to install an irrigation system across 3.8 acres for the soccer fields at Hickory Creek Soccer Park. The North Scott Soccer Club serves over 400 youth there with their soccer programs and also assisted with funding.

Sanctuary Gardens was beautified with landscaping upgrades to include 6 park bench gardens and 1 memorial bench garden. This completed project gives the park a whole new look.

Sheridan Meadows 4-Plex parking lot has been resurfaced.










