

The City of Eldridge, Iowa met in open session at the Eldridge Community Center at 7:00 p.m., January 18, 2022. Roll call vote showed Mayor Frank King, council members Brian Dockery, Bruce Cheek, Dan Collins, and Bernie Peeters with Adrian Blackwell absent. Also, present were Mark Ridolfi, Adriane Moen, Stephanie Telsrow, Collin Telsrow, John Robenison, Derek Hamilton, Tony Rupe, and Denise Benson

Agenda – Motion by Dockery to approve the agenda as presented, second by Cheek. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.

Public Comment – none.

Mayor's Agenda

- A. Consideration to approve the minutes of January 3, 2022. Motion by Cheek to approve the minutes, second by Peeters. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- B. Consideration to approve bills payable in the amount of \$394,532.68. One check was pulled from Hy-Vee for meals for academy candidates for further clarification. Motion to approve the amended bills payable by Dockery, second by Peeters. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- C. Approval of four Liquor License Applications: Big 10 Mart (E LeClaire Road), Big 10 Mart (S. 16th Ave), Edwards Entertainments (the PlayStation), and Eldridge Mart. Motion by Dockery to approve all four licenses, second by Cheek. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- D. Mayor King read a Proclamation of Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month.

- A. Consideration of Third Reading of Ordinance 2022-01 Rezoning Lot 2 of Aberrant 1st Addition from I-1 Light Industrial to C-3 General Commercial. Motion by Cheek to approve the third reading, second by Collins. Roll call vote showed Cheek, Peeters, Collins and Dockery voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- B. Consideration of Third Reading of Ordinance 2022-02 Rezoning Lot 1 of Aberrant 1st Addition from I-1 Light Industrial to C-3 General Commercial. Motion by Peeters to approve the third reading, second by Dockery. Roll call vote showed Cheek, Peeters, Collins, and Dockery voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- C. Consideration of the Second Reading of Ordinance 2022-03 Updating City Code Stop Intersections. Motion by Collins to approve the second reading, second by Peeters. Roll call vote showed Peeters, Collins, Dockery and Cheek voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- D. Consideration of the Second Reading of Ordinance 2022-04 Updating City Code Yield Intersections. Motion by Dockery to approve the second reading, second by Cheek. Roll call vote showed Peeters, Collins, Dockery and Cheek voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- E. Consideration of Second Reading of Ordinance 2022-05 Setting Sewer Rates. Motion by Dockery to approve the second reading, second by Peeters. Roll call vote showed Collins, Dockery, Cheek, and Peeters voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- F. Consideration per Employee Personnel Policy Article IV in the amount of \$21,000, which includes Attorney fees of \$1,700 and Authorizing the City Attorney to prepare an Appropriate Settlement Agreement and Release Consistent with the Settlement for Former Police Chief Dave Kopatich. Motion by Dockery to approve the expenditure, second by Cheek. Roll call vote showed Dockery, Cheek, Peeters and Collins voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.

- A. Consideration of 2022 Street Closure Request from North Scott Chamber. Motion by Dockery to approve the street closures, second by Peeters. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- B. Consideration of Resolution 2022-02 Vacating an Easement in Townsend Farms 13th Addition, Lot 5 & 6. Motion by Peeters to approve the resolution, second by Collins. Roll call vote showed Cheek, Peeters, Collins and Dockery voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- C. Consideration of Resolution 2022-03 Approval of Hiring a Financial Consultant to Assist with the FY 23 Budget. Motion by Dockery to approve the resolution, second by Peeters.

Roll call vote showed Peeters, Collins, Dockery and Cheek voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.

- D. Consideration of Moving the Monday February 7th City Council Meeting to Tuesday February 8th to Avoid conflict with the Iowa Caucuses. Motion by Peeters to move the meeting to February 8th, second by Dockery. Peeters, Collins and Dockery voting aye, Cheek nay. Motion carried.
