

The City of Eldridge, Iowa met in open session at the Eldridge Community Center at 7:00 p.m., April 4, 2022. Roll call vote showed Mayor Frank King, council members Brian Dockery, Bruce Cheek, Dan Collins, Adrian Blackwell, and Bernie Peeters. Also, present were Mark Ridolfi, Marty O'Boyle, David McCammant, Kilynn Marsengill, Marilyn Marsengill, Dale Grunwald, Joe Sisler, Brian Wessel, Derek Hamilton, Tony Rupe, and Denise Benson

Agenda – Cheek asked to add item 8. Activity Reports to the agenda. Motion by Dockery to approve the amended agenda, second by Blackwell. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote

Public Comment – Kilynn Marsengill asked if the city could proclaim May as Ehlers Danlos Syndrome awareness month.

Mayor's Agenda

- A. Consideration to approve the minutes of March 21, 2022. Motion by Blackwell to approve the minutes, second by Cheek. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- B. Consideration to approve bills payable in the amount of \$1,391,350.55. Motion by Peeters to approve the bills, second by Blackwell. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- C. MidAmerican Energy Trees Please! Grant Presentation. David McCammant with MidAmerican was present to present a check to the city in the amount of \$3,000 for tree planting around the city.
- D. Approval of the renewal of liquor license for Rudy's Tacos. Motion by Cheek to approve the renewal, second by Dockery. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- E. Approval of the renewal of liquor license for Cabos. Motion by Dockery to approve the renewal, second by Blackwell. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- F. Appointment of Economic Development Committee. Mayor King recommended Nathan Kessler, Joe Stutting (NS School Rep), Samantha Yokum (NS Chamber Rep), Patrick Reid, Steve Fahrenkrog, Lacey Daedlow, and Mitch Cunningham along with Brian Dockery as Liaison to the Council. Some of the Council felt the NS Chamber should pick the person to represent the Chamber. Motion by Dockery to remove Samantha Yokum and put Tabitha Kramer on the committee until the Chamber can decide who they want to represent the chamber for the committee, second by Peeters. Dockery, Blackwell, Peeters and Collins voting aye, Cheek nay. Motion carried.

- A. Approval of Resolution 2022-15 Formalizing the 1st and LeClaire Intersection Project. Motion by Dockery to approve the resolution, second by Collins. Roll call vote showed Cheek, Blackwell, Peeters, Collins and Dockery voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- B. A Public Hearing was opened at 7:26 P.M., on the Authorization of a Loan and Disbursement Agreement and the Issuance of Notes to Evidence the Obligation of the City Thereunder. No comments were made. Motion by Dockery to close the public hearing at 7:20 p.m., second by Peeters. Motion approved unanimously by voice vote.
- C. Approval of Resolution 2022-16 Instituting Proceedings to Take Additional Action for the Authorization of a Loan and Disbursement Agreement and the Issuance of Not to Exceed \$288,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes. Motion by Peeters to approve the resolution, second by Blackwell. Roll call vote showed Blackwell, Peeters, Collins, Dockery and Cheek voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- D. A Public Hearing was opened at 7:33 on the Authorization of a loan and Disbursement Agreement and the Issuance of Notes to Evidence the Obligation of the City Thereunder. No comments were made. Motion by Dockery to close the public hearing at 7:34 p.m., second by Cheek. Roll call vote showed Peeters, Collins, Dockery, Cheek, and Blackwell voting aye no nays. Motion carried.
- E. Resolution 2022-17 Instituting Proceedings to Take Additional Action for the Authorization of a Loan and Disbursement Agreement and the Issuance of Not to Exceed \$487,000 Sewer Revenue Capital Loan Notes. Motion by Blackwell to approve the resolution, second by Peeters. Roll call vote showed Collins, Dockery, Cheek, Blackwell and Peeters voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.

- A. Resolution 2022-18 fixing date for a meeting in the proposition to authorize a loan and disbursement agreement and the issuance of notes to evidence the obligations of the city thereunder. Motion by Collins to approve the resolution, second by Peeters. Roll call vote showed Dockery, Cheek, Blackwell, Peeters and Collins voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- B. Resolution 2022-19 consideration of Approving the Final Plat of Meadows at Fox Run 1st Addition. Motion by Dockery to approve the resolution, second by Collins. Roll call vote showed Cheek, Blackwell, Peeters, Collins and Dockery voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- C. Resolution 2022-20 Consideration for Approving the Final Plat of RLC Addition. Motion by Blackwell to approve the resolution, second by Peeters. Roll call vote showed Blackwell, Peeters, Collins, Dockery and Cheek voting aye, no nays. Motion carried.
- D. Resolution 2022-21 Consideration for Approving FY22 Interfund Transfers. Motion by Blackwell to approve the resolution, second by Dockery. Roll call vote showed Peeters, Collins, Dockery, Cheek, and Blackwell voting aye
